

Indiana's Employment and Labor Force Estimates December 2020

01/21/2021





Key Points

- Indiana's unemployment rate stands at 4.3% in December 2020. The U.S. is at 6.7%.
- Indiana's Labor Force is at 3,390,973.
- Indiana's Labor Force increased by 83,609 due to an increase in employment of 107,512 and a decrease in unemployment of 23,903.
- Indiana's Labor Force has increased 2,114 over the year.
- Indiana's Labor Force Participation Rate is at 64.0%. This is above the U.S. Labor Force Participation Rate of 61.5%.




Key Points: December 2020

Current Employment Statistics (CES)

LAUS (Labor Force by Residence)

This counts people, not jobs, and is...

- An estimate of employment based on where the employee lives, rather than where they work
- Used in calculating the labor force

CES (Employment by Job)

This counts jobs, not people, and is...

- An estimate of employment based on the location of the job regardless of the worker's residence
- Also called nonag wage and salary or nonfarm employment
- Used in Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages (QCEW), Occupational Employment Statistics (OES) and CES data




CES Monthly Jobs Report



Avg. Weekly Manufacturing Production Hours

December 2020 average weekly hours for Indiana manufacturing production hours increased by 2.2 hours to 43.9 hours. National manufacturing hours increased by 0.4 hours to 41.9 weekly hours, and Midwest states increased at 0.1 hours to 41.8 hours (November 2020 data).




Indiana Labor Force Participation Rate Compared to U.S.





Purchasing Managers' Index (PMI)

- •The Purchasing Managers Index (PMI) is a measure of the prevailing direction of economic trends in manufacturing.
- •The PMI is based on a monthly survey of supply chain managers across 19 industries, covering both upstream and downstream activity.
- •The value and movements in the PMI and its components can provide useful insight to business decision makers, market analysts, and investors, and is a leading indicator of overall economic activity in the U.S.



PMI is a number from 0 to 100. A PMI above 50 represents an expansion when compared with the previous month. A PMI reading under 50 represents a contraction.
