

Indiana's Employment and Labor Force Estimates February 2016

3/22/2016





- Indiana total private employment growth was 6,900 over the month making this the seventh month above the prior March 2000 peak. Now at 30,600 above that level, the new peak for private employment is 2,643,200 for Indiana. US private employment grew by 230,000 over the month, a rate of (0.2%).
- Indiana private sector employment is up 46,800 from a year ago. This is annual growth of 1.8% which is less than the national growth rate of 2.2% over the year. Over the month gains were strongest in Trade 6,900. Private Educational & Health Services saw gains of 4,500 over the month. Total Nonfarm gained 7,400. Construction saw gains of 300 over the month. Private Educational Services saw gains of 1,600 over the month. Trade, Transportation and Utilities saw gains of 5,000 over the month.

Key sectors showing job decreases in February:

- Manufacturing saw declines of 2,600 over the month. Economic activity in the manufacturing sector contracted nationwide in February for the third consecutive month, while the overall economy grew for the 80th consecutive month. (the latest Manufacturing ISM index = 49.5)
- Professional & Business Service saw declines of 3,000 over the month.
- Financial Activities saw declines of 400 over the month.
- Average weekly hours for Indiana manufacturing decreased for the second month in a row from 41.9 to 41.2 in February. The two month change from December to January shows a drop of 1.9 hours. The National average also fell from 41.7 to 41.4 in February.
- Nationally in February, average hourly earnings for all employees on private nonfarm payrolls, at \$25.48, changed little (-5 cent), following no change in January. Over the year, average hourly earnings have risen by 2 percent. Average hourly earnings for all employees in Indiana fell by 23 cents from \$22.32 to \$23.09 in January, earnings have risen by 23 cents over the year in Indiana, a 1.0% increase.



Key Points

LAUS Household Survey:

- Indiana's February seasonally adjusted unemployment rate stands at 4.7%. This is a .1% increase from last month. Indiana's rate is down -0.5% from last year. Nationally the unemployment rate is 4.9%.
- Indiana's labor force gained 22,653 over the month, with gains in employment of 16,483. Unemployment estimates rose by 6,170. Indiana's Labor Force Participation rate increased by 0.4 to 64.6% over the month. This remains above the US Labor Force Participation rate which stands at 62.9%.
- Indiana's Labor Force is up 73,033 over the year, and has gained 139,975 since January 2013. Indiana's labor force stands at 3,323,187. Indiana's unemployment is down by 12,350 over the year, and 109,299 since January 2013.


CES Payroll/ Establishment Survey:

- Private employment is up 46,800 from a year ago (1.8%). US private employment grew by 2,597,000 over the month, a rate of (0.2%). Nationally, private sector employment is up by 2.2% over the year.
- Since January 2013 Indiana private employment has grown by 150,300 (6.0%). Private sector monthly job growth has averaged about 3,955 over the last three years.



Total nonfarm employment surpassed March 2000 peak levels in July of 2015 and this streak through February 2016. Private employment stands 20,800 above prior peak. Indiana's new private sector peak based on preliminary February numbers now stands at 2,643,200 which is 30,600 above the former high.

Indiana Private Sector Employment




March 2000 Peak

LAUS estimates saw gains of over 16,483 in employment and 6,170 in unemployment increasing the Labor Force overall by 22,653. Employment gains in LAUS are outpacing total nonfarm gains in CES. The LAUS employment estimates include self-employed and agricultural workers.

Indiana private sector employment gained 6,900 over the month and is up 46,800 over the year. Strongest gains over the year have been in Trade, Transportation and Warehousing, Private Educational and Health Services, and Leisure and Hospitality.

Indiana job growth over the year is slightly under the National trend in private sector gains for the third consecutive month. Indiana Manufacturing still is ahead of the US in year to year comparisons, but is down 500 years for the first two months of 2016. Leisure and Hospitality and Trade are stronger than the US over all three time frames.

IN Employment Change Compared to the U.S.








Indiana & U.S. Labor Force, 2007-2016 (in 1000s)

Employment to Population Ratio (seasonally adjusted)




Indiana U.S. Neighboring States (Avg)

Indiana's Labor Force is up 73,033 over the year, and has gained 139,975 since January 2013. Indiana's labor force stands at 3,323,187. The labor force participation rate now stands at 64.6. This is the highest this as been since August 2009. This is still 3.8 below the 2000 LFP of 68.4.


