

Indiana's Employment and Labor Force Estimates July 2018

08/15/2018



Key Points

- Indiana's unemployment rate increased by 0.1% over the month to 3.4% for July 2018. The U.S. rate decreased 0.1% to 3.9%.
- Indiana's rate has decreased 0.2% over the year from July 2017.
- Indiana's Labor Force increased over the month by 15,564; due to an increase in residence employment of 12,600 and an increase in unemployment of 2,964.
- Indiana's Labor Force has increased 54,793 over the year.
- Indiana's Labor Force Participation Rate is at 64.8%. This is above the U.S. Labor Force Participation Rate which remains at 62.9%.



Key Points

- Indiana's total private employment increased by 5,600 jobs over the month and had gains of 24,800 over the year.
- Indiana private employment now stands at 2,703,800.

Employed persons (Current Population Survey)

Persons 16 years and over in the civilian noninstitutional population who, during the reference week, (a) did any work at all (at least 1 hour) as paid employees; worked in their own business, profession, or on their own farm, or worked 15 hours or more as unpaid workers in an enterprise operated by a member of the family; and (b) all those who were not working but who had jobs or businesses from which they were temporarily absent because of vacation, illness, bad weather, childcare problems, maternity or paternity leave, labor-management dispute, job training, or other family or personal reasons, whether or not they were paid for the time off or were seeking other jobs. Each employed person is counted only once, even if he or she holds more than one job. Excluded are persons whose only activity consisted of work around their own house (painting, repairing, or own home housework) or volunteer work for religious, charitable, and other organizations.

Unemployed persons (Current Population Survey)

Persons aged 16 years and older who had no employment during the reference week, were available for work, except for temporary illness, and had made specific efforts to find employment sometime during the 4-week period ending with the reference week. Persons who were waiting to be recalled to a job from which they had been laid off need not have been looking for work to be classified as unemployed.

Marginally attached workers (Current Population Survey)

Persons not in the labor force who want and are available for work, and who have looked for a job sometime in the prior 12 months (or since the end of their last job if they held one within the past 12 months), but were not counted as unemployed because they had not searched for work in the 4 weeks preceding the survey. Discouraged workers are a subset of the marginally attached.

Discouraged workers (Current Population Survey)

Persons not in the labor force who want and are available for a job and who have looked for work sometime in the past 12 months (or since the end of their last job if they held one within the past 12 months), but who are not currently looking because they believe there are no jobs available or there are none for which they would qualify.

Current Employment Statistics (CES) Compared to Local Area Unemployment Statistics (LAUS)

LAUS (Labor Force by Residence)


- An estimate of employment based on where the employee lives, rather than where they work
- This is a count of people, not jobs
- Used in calculating the labor force

CES (Employment by Job)

- An estimate or count of employment based on the location of the job regardless of the worker's residence
- Also called nonag wage and salary or nonfarm employment
- This counts jobs, not people
- Used in Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages (QCEW), Occupational Employment Statistics (OES) and CES data

July 2018 total private employment is 14,900 above the December 2017 peak.

Indiana Private Sector Employment





July 2018 Indiana private sector employment increased by 5,600 jobs over the month and is up 24,800 over the year. Professional & Business Services gained 2,700 jobs and Construction gained 2,000 jobs over the month.

July 2018 estimates show Indiana has gained 380,600 in Private jobs since the July 2009 trough. Manufacturing has accounted for 110,500 of those jobs. Construction has gained 27,500.



Since the low point of employment in July 2009, private sector employment growth for Indiana trails the U.S. growth rate. Indiana is now at 16.4% while the U.S. is at 17.2% through July 2018. BLS Midwest Regional states have grown at 12.9% during this time frame.

Private Sector Job Growth Since the Low Point of Employment in Indiana






CES June Total Non Farm preliminary estimates were revised down 6,100 jobs. Private employment was revised down by 800 jobs. The change from May to June is now a decrease of 7,800 jobs in Total Non-Farm and a decrease of 3,300 jobs in private employment.

Unemployment Rate 2009 - 2018 (seasonally adjusted)



Indiana's July seasonally adjusted labor force is now at 3,380,622 up 15,564 from June. The number of employed is at 3,265,423 an increase of 12,600 over the month. These preliminary Labor Force and Employment numbers are new peaks for Indiana. An estimated 115,199 individuals are currently unemployed and seeking employment.

Labor Force Change Since December 2017 Indiana Peak (seasonally adjusted)







The July Indiana labor force participation rate is at 64.8% and the U.S. rate is at 62.9%.


Labor Force Participation Rate


The six state measures are based on the same definitions as those published for the U.S.:

- •U-1, persons unemployed 15 weeks or longer, as a percent of the civilian labor force;
- •U-2, job losers and persons who completed temporary jobs, as a percent of the civilian labor force;
- •U-3, total unemployed, as a percent of the civilian labor force (this is the definition used for the official unemployment rate);
- •U-4, total unemployed plus discouraged workers, as a percent of the civilian labor force plus discouraged workers;
- •U-5, total unemployed, plus discouraged workers, plus all other marginally attached workers, as a percent of the civilian labor force plus all marginally attached workers; and
- •U-6, total unemployed, plus all marginally attached workers, plus total employed part time for economic reasons, as a percent of the civilian labor force plus all marginally attached workers.

July 2018 average weekly hours for Indiana manufacturing production fell by 1.1 to 41.2. National manufacturing fell by 0.4 to 41.8 weekly hours. Midwest states stood at 41.5 hours per week (June 2018 data).
