

# Indiana's Employment and Labor Force Estimates June 2020 07/17/2020





## **Key Points**


- Indiana's unemployment rate stands at 11.2% in June 2020. The U.S. is at 11.1%.
- Indiana's Labor Force is at 3,393,789.
- Indiana's Labor Force increased 53,484 due to an increase in employment of 82,231 and a decrease in unemployment of 28,747.
- Indiana's Labor Force has increased 19,916 over the year.
- Indiana's Labor Force Participation Rate is at 64.3%. This is above the U.S. Labor Force Participation Rate of 61.5%.

#### **Indiana's Private Employment**

- Increased by 128,900 jobs over the month and had loses of 182,200 over the year.
- June private employment = 2,552,400.

# Comparing Local Area Unemployment Statistics (LAUS) and Current Employment Statistics (CES)

#### LAUS (Labor Force by Residence)

## This counts people, not jobs, and is...

- An estimate of employment based on where the employee lives, rather than where they work
- Used in calculating the labor force

#### **CES** (Employment by Job)

## This counts jobs, not people, and is...

- An estimate of employment based on the location of the job regardless of the worker's residence
- Also called nonag wage and salary or nonfarm employment
- Used in Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages (QCEW), Occupational Employment Statistics (OES) and CES data












#### Indiana Labor Force Pct. Change Since July '09 Indiana Trough

Indiana is at 64.3% compared to U.S. at 61.5%






#### **Employment to Population Ratio (seasonally adjusted)**

The Indiana Employment to Population Ratio for June 2020 is 57.0% compared to the U.S. at 54.6% and border states at 51.5% (May)


#### Employment to Population Ratio (seasonally adjusted)

- U-2, job losers and persons who completed temporary jobs, as a percent of the civilian labor force;
- U-3, total unemployed, as a percent of the civilian labor force (this is the definition used for the official unemployment rate);
- U-4, total unemployed plus discouraged workers, as a percent of the civilian labor force plus discouraged workers;
- U-5, total unemployed, plus discouraged workers, plus all other marginally attached workers, as a
  percent of the civilian labor force plus all marginally attached workers; and
- U-6, total unemployed, plus all marginally attached workers, plus total employed part time for economic reasons, as a percent of the civilian labor force plus all marginally attached workers.






Total aggregated UI claims for the first 8 weeks of each year as reported to ETA.






Total aggregated UI claims for the first 11 weeks of each year as reported to ETA.






Total aggregated UI claims for the first 14 weeks of each year as reported to ETA.






Total aggregated UI claims for the first 18 weeks of each year as reported to ETA.






Total aggregated UI claims for the first 23 weeks of each year as reported to ETA.

#### **Purchasing Managers' Index (PMI)**

- •The Purchasing Managers Index (PMI) is a measure of the prevailing direction of economic trends in manufacturing.
- •The PMI is based on a monthly survey of supply chain managers across 19 industries, covering both upstream and downstream activity.
- •The value and movements in the PMI and its components can provide useful insight to business decision makers, market analysts, and investors, and is a leading indicator of overall economic activity in the U.S.



PMI is a number from 0 to 100. A PMI above 50 represents an expansion when compared with the previous month. A PMI reading under 50 represents a contraction.
