


Indiana's Employment and Labor Force Estimates June 2021

07/14/2021





Key Points

- Indiana's unemployment rate is 4.1%. The U.S. is at 5.9%.
- Indiana's Labor Force is at 3,348,279.
- Indiana's Labor Force increased by 4,148 due to an increase in employment of 1,134 and an increase in unemployment of 3,014.
- Indiana's Labor Force has increased 64,039 over the year.
- Indiana's Labor Force Participation Rate remained at 63.2%.
 This is above the U.S. Labor Force Participation Rate of 61.6%.




Key Points: June 2021

Indiana's Private Employment

- Increased by 8,900 jobs over the month and recovered 123,500 jobs over the year.
- June private employment = 2,628,600.







Comparing Local Area Unemployment Statistics (LAUS) and Current Employment Statistics (CES)

LAUS (Labor Force by Residence)

This counts people, not jobs, and is...

- An estimate of employment based on where the employee lives, rather than where they work
- Used in calculating the labor force

CES (Employment by Job)

This counts jobs, not people, and is...

- An estimate of employment based on the location of the job regardless of the worker's residence
- Also called nonag wage and salary or nonfarm employment
- Used in Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages (QCEW), Occupational Employment Statistics (OES) and CES data





Avg. Weekly Manufacturing Production Hours

June 2021 average weekly hours for Indiana manufacturing production hours increased by 0.1 hours to 43.2 hours. National manufacturing hours decreased to 0.1 hours to 41.4 weekly hours, and Midwest states increased at 0.3 hours to 41.2 hours (May 2021 data).

Indiana Labor Force Participation Rate Compared to U.S. Indiana is at 63.2% compared to the U.S. at 61.6%






Employment to Population Ratio (seasonally adjusted)



For the Reference Week of Each Month



Current Population Survey Methodology

- Administered by the Census Bureau
- Probability selected sample of about 60,000 occupied households
- References the week that includes the 12th of the month.
- Households from all 50 states and the District of Columbia
- 4-8-4 month rule to minimize participant burden and, for consistency, and to replenish the sample
- 15 years of age or over and not in the Armed Forces, or institutionalized

- No upper age limit
- Publishes data only for aged 16 and over. Students and nonstudents treated the same
- A "reference person" who either owns or rents the housing unit typically responds for the household
- Topics include but are not limited to demographic and household dynamics, income, hourly weekly earnings, salary, annual work activity and income, veteran status, school enrollment, contingent employment, industry, occupation, multiple job holders, worker displacement, and job tenure, among other topics, not in the labor force, and labor force attachment

Quarterly Current Population Survey

Men out of the labor force are below the levels prior to the pandemic. Women not in the labor force are above pre-pandemic levels by nearly 100,000.

Purchasing Managers' Index (PMI)

- •The Purchasing Managers Index (PMI) is a measure of the prevailing direction of economic trends in manufacturing.
- •The PMI is based on a monthly survey of supply chain managers across 19 industries, covering both upstream and downstream activity.
- •The value and movements in the PMI and its components can provide useful insight to business decision makers, market analysts, and investors, and is a leading indicator of overall economic activity in the U.S.




PMI is a number from 0 to 100. A PMI above 50 represents an expansion when compared with the previous month. A PMI reading under 50 represents a contraction.
