
- Indiana's unemployment rate stands at 3.2% in March 2020. The U.S. is at 4.4%.
- Indiana's rate is 0.3% lower than it was over the year from March 2019.
- Indiana's Labor Force decreased 119,073 due to a decrease in employment of 118,682 and a decrease in unemployment of 391.
- Indiana's Labor Force has decreased 113,884 over the year.
- Indiana's Labor Force Participation Rate is at 62.2%. This is below the U.S. Labor Force Participation Rate of 62.7%.



Key Points: March 2020

Indiana's Private Employment

- Decreased by 18,700 jobs over the month and had loses of 17,800 over the year.
- March private employment = 2,727,300.

Comparing Local Area Unemployment Statistics (LAUS) and Current Employment Statistics (CES)

LAUS (Labor Force by Residence)

This counts people, not jobs, and is...

- An estimate of employment based on where the employee lives, rather than where they work
- Used in calculating the labor force

CES (Employment by Job)

This counts jobs, not people, and is...

- An estimate of employment based on the location of the job regardless of the worker's residence
- Also called nonag wage and salary or nonfarm employment
- Used in Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages (QCEW), Occupational Employment Statistics (OES) and CES data







Indiana is trailing the U.S. in private job growth since July 2009. The U.S. has grown by 19.3% while Indiana has grown by 17.2%.


Private Sector Job Growth Since the Low Point of Employment in Indiana






Avg. Weekly Manufacturing Production Hours




Indiana Labor Force Pct. Growth Since July '09 Indiana Trough

Labor Force Change Since July 2009 Indiana Trough (seasonally adjusted)








Employment to Population Ratio (seasonally adjusted)

The six state measures are based on the same definitions as those published for the U.S.:

- U-1, persons unemployed 15 weeks or longer, as a percent of the civilian labor force;
- U-2, job losers and persons who completed temporary jobs, as a percent of the civilian labor force;
- U-3, total unemployed, as a percent of the civilian labor force (this is the definition used for the official unemployment rate);
- U-4, total unemployed plus discouraged workers, as a percent of the civilian labor force plus discouraged workers;
- U-5, total unemployed, plus discouraged workers, plus all other marginally attached workers, as a
 percent of the civilian labor force plus all marginally attached workers; and
- U-6, total unemployed, plus all marginally attached workers, plus total employed part time for economic reasons, as a percent of the civilian labor force plus all marginally attached workers.



Weekly Initial Claims – Week 8


Total aggregated UI claims for the first 8 weeks of each year as reported to ETA.





Weekly Initial Claims – Week 11


Total aggregated UI claims for the first 11 weeks of each year as reported to ETA.







Purchasing Managers' Index (PMI)

- •The Purchasing Managers Index (PMI) is a measure of the prevailing direction of economic trends in manufacturing.
- •The PMI is based on a monthly survey of supply chain managers across 19 industries, covering both upstream and downstream activity.
- •The value and movements in the PMI and its components can provide useful insight to business decision makers, market analysts, and investors, and is a leading indicator of overall economic activity in the U.S.



PMI is a number from 0 to 100. A PMI above 50 represents an expansion when compared with the previous month. A PMI reading under 50 represents a contraction.
