Statistical Data Report for June 2013, Released August 2013

Regional and State Unemployment (seasonally adjusted)

Regional and state unemployment rates were little changed in June. Twenty-eight states had unemployment rate increases, 11 states had decreases, and 11 states and the District of Columbia had no change, the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics reported. Thirty-seven states and the District of Columbia had unemployment rate decreases from a year earlier, seven states had increases, and six states had no change. The national jobless rate was unchanged from May at 7.6 percent but was 0.6 percentage point lower than in June 2012.

Nevada had the highest unemployment rate among the states in June, 9.6 percent. The next highest rates were in Illinois and Mississippi, 9.2 percent and 9.0 percent, respectively. North Dakota again had the lowest jobless rate, 3.1 percent. In total, 19 states had jobless rates significantly lower than the U.S. figure of 7.6 percent, nine states and the District of Columbia had measurably higher rates, and 22 states had rates that were not appreciably different from that of the nation.







Unemployed Persons per Job Opening in May 2013

(Excerpted from the U.S. Dept. of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics, The Editor's Desk — July 10, 2013)

There were 3.8 million job openings on the last business day of May, little changed from April. The unemployed person per job opening ratio has trended downward since the end of the recession and was 3.1 in May 2013.

Note: Shaded area represents recession as determined by the National Bureau of Economic Research.

When the most recent recession began (December 2007), the number of unemployed persons per job opening was 1.8. When the recession ended (June 2009), there were 6.2 unemployed persons per job opening.

The number of job openings was little changed over the month in most industries but rose in retail trade and fell in professional and business services. The number of job openings rose in the Midwest but was essentially unchanged in the other three regions.

These data are from the Job Openings and Labor Turnover Survey and the Current Population Survey. Job openings data for the most recent month are preliminary and subject to revision. 
