Statistical Data Report for May 2013, Released July 2013

Regional and State Unemployment (seasonally adjusted)

Regional and state unemployment rates were little changed in May. Twenty-five states had unemployment rate decreases, 17 states had increases, and 8 states and the District of Columbia had no change, the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics reported. Forty-one states and the District of Columbia had unemployment rate decreases from a year earlier, four states had increases, and five states had no change. The national jobless rate was essentially unchanged from April at 7.6 percent but was 0.6 percentage point lower than in May 2012.

In May, the West continued to have the highest regional unemployment rate, 7.8 percent, while the Midwest and South had the lowest rates, 7.2 percent each. Over the month, the West had the only statistically significant unemployment rate change (-0.2 percentage point). Significant over-the-year rate changes occurred in three regions: the West (-1.6 percentage points), Northeast (-0.7 point), and South (-0.6 point).








