Economic Growth Region 8

Regional and State Unemployment (seasonally adjusted)

Regional and state unemployment rates were generally lower in June. Thirty-nine states and the District of Columbia recorded unemployment rate decreases, five states had increases and six states had no change, the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics reported. Twenty-four states recorded unemployment rate increases from a year earlier, 22 states and the District of Columbia had decreases and four states had no change. The national jobless rate edged down by 0.2 percentage point to 9.5 percent and was unchanged from June 2009. Nevada again reported the highest unemployment rate among the states, 14.2 percent in June. The states with the next highest rates were Michigan, 13.2 percent; California, 12.3 percent; and Rhode Island, 12.0 percent. North Dakota continued to register the lowest jobless rate, 3.6 percent, followed by South Dakota and Nebraska, 4.5 and 4.8 percent, respectively.





Per Capita Personal Income, 2008

The U.S. Bureau of Economic Analysis provides per capita personal income.

Per capita personal income (PCPI) is determined by dividing an area's total income by the area's population estimate. Income levels of certain population groups may affect per capita personal income. For example, the presence of a large institutionalized population will tend to lower the per capita personal income of the area in which it is located.


