State Employment and Unemployment

Unemployment rates were higher in February in 1 state and stable in 49 states and the District of Columbia, the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics reported. Thirty states had jobless rate increases from a year earlier, 1 state had a decrease, and 19 states and the district had little change. The national unemployment rate changed little over the month at 4.1 percent but was 0.2 percentage point higher than in February 2024.

Nonfarm payroll employment increased in 3 states and was essentially unchanged in 47 states and the District of Columbia in February 2025. Over the year, nonfarm payroll employment increased in 17 states and was essentially unchanged in 33 states and the district.

South Dakota had the lowest jobless rate in February, 1.9 percent. Nevada had the highest unemployment rate, 5.8 percent. In total, 18 states had unemployment rates lower than the U.S. figure of 4.1 percent, 5 states and the District of Columbia had higher rates, and 27 states had rates that were not appreciably different from that of the nation.

In February, Florida had the only unemployment rate change (+0.1 percentage point). The The remaining 49 states and the District of Columbia had jobless rates that were not notably different from those of a month earlier, though some had changes that were at least as large numerically as the significant change.

Thirty states had unemployment rate increases from February 2024, the largest of which were in Michigan (+1.4 percentage points) and Mississippi (+1.0 point). The only over-the-year rate decrease occurred in Montana (0.2 percentage point). Nineteen states and the district of


