# **Economic Growth Region 4**

Statistical Data Report for April 2025, Released June 2025

State Employment and Unemployment

Unemployment rates were higher in April in 3 states and the District of Columbia, lower in 2 states, and stable in 45 states, the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics reported. Twenty-six states and the District had jobless rate increases from a year earlier, 1 state had a decrease, and 23 states had little change. The national unemployment rate was unchangedat 4.2 percent but was 0.3 percentage point higher than in April 2024.


Local Area Unemployment Statistics (LAUS): Captures Indiana's labor force, which includes those currently employed and those who are unemployed and actively seeking work.
