Economic Growth Region 4

Statistical Data Report for August 2025, Released October 2025 **State Employment and Unemployment**

Unemployment rates were higher in August in 3 states, lower in 2 states, and stable in 45 states and the District of Columbia, the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics reported. Seventeen states and the District had jobless rate increases from a year earlier, 9 states had decreases, and 24 states had little change. The national unemployment rate, 4.3 percent, changed little over the month and from August 2024.




More about the US Bureau of Labor Statistics data sources used within:
